Beginning in a small cottage at the old Coromandel Hospital, providing information about disabilities for people in the community.
1994

Samuel James Reserve Renovation

CILT purchases and restores the historic building in Coromandel Town Centre. The building now houses the Info Centre and public toilets, which CILT maintains.

Artists in The Making

Art programme for people with a disability. Based in Whitianga.

A purpose built complex in Coromandel Town.

Part-time coordinator for the Housing Project is employed.

Kapanga Flats

TCDC sells the Pensioner Housing at Kapanga Road to CILT.

First sites go live.

Development of Te Pūtahi Whaiora

CILT moves into their newly built building, 'The Hub'. This is them renamed officially to Te Pūtahi Whaiora.

The Harray Track

CILT begins construction of track and manages maintenance.
2009 - 2021

Coromandel On Track

CILT employs a full-time Coordinator for the Walkways project.

Community Max

Work skills programme, employing 14 people on the Harray Track, pest eradication and native tree planting. 2 more programmes in 2010 employed 18 more people.

Family development programme.

Incredible Years

CILT partners with Ministry of Education to deliver The Incredible Years parent programme.
2012 - current

The Goldmine

CILT opened the Coromandel reuse centre.

CILT began owning and operating Coromandel's secondhand store.
July 2019 - current

Te Puāwai — Native Plant Nursery

Construction began in 2019. Originally intended as a transition to work programme, Te Puāwai now runs as a social enterprise.

Sip n' Scoop

A rangatahi-led initiative started on the vacant site next to The Bizarre.

Māra Kai

Gardens created at Te Puāwai to support the foodbank and local community with fresh produce.
